Categories, Definitions and Benefits

Full Member - Eligibility

To be eligible for full membership in the YMA a physician must be licensed and in good standing with the Yukon Medical Council. A physician must also be a resident of the Yukon.

Full Member – First Year Pro-rated Fees

The YMA membership year is from April 1 to March 31. As a new Full Member to the Yukon Medical Association your initial membership fee will be prorated over the remaining months of the membership year that you joined. On renewal of your membership the fee is annual and the renewal fees of Full Members are subject to a late charge.

Conjoint Membership with the CMA

The YMA is a conjoint division of the CMA and as such you cannot be a member of the YMA without also being a member of the CMA. If you have paid CMA dues in another jurisdiction for the CMA's membership year (Jan-Dec) we do not collect it again. We reserve the right to verify that payment. If you have not paid the CMA membership fee for that CMA year, we will charge a fee prorated for the remaining months of the CMA membership year (Jan-Dec).

Application Process

1. Read the definitions to clarify which membership category you are applying for. If you are unclear on this matter please contact the YMA at office@yukondoctors.ca
2. Complete and return the last page of this document. Your pro-rated membership fee will be calculated and an invoice sent to you for payment.

Visiting Specialist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> is registered and in good standing with the Yukon Medical Council as a specialist, resides in Canada, but outside Yukon, and provides medical services in the Yukon on an itinerant basis
Retired	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> was formerly a Full Member, retired as of April 1 of the new membership year, and during the membership year will not be earning any income from providing professional medical services, including medical consulting or medical expert opinion advice

Non-Resident	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • is a physician licensed to practice in another jurisdiction in Canada and in good standing with the body or bodies responsible for licensing physicians in each jurisdiction in which the person is licensed to practice, • resides in Canada, but outside Yukon, and • is not a Visiting Specialist
Medical Resident	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • is enrolled in a post-graduate medical program at an accredited medical school in Canada
Medical Student	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • is enrolled in a undergraduate medical program at an accredited medical school in Canada

Member Benefits

*** YMA Funds**

These funds are negotiated as Contribution Agreements with the Government of Yukon. The guidelines and application forms for these funds are available on the member side of the YMA website - yukondoctors.ca - or by emailing funds@yukondoctors.ca Access to the funds is as follows:

- Full Members > access to all funds, providing individual fund requirements are met
- Visiting Specialist Members > access to CME Fund only
- Resident non-members and locum physicians > access to CMPA Fund only

Amounts received under the benefit programs are required to be included in the income of the recipient in the year in which they were received. Original receipts should be retained. A copy of a T4A slip for each year will be mailed to you at the address that is on file and should be received in early March.

CME Program

To assist resident physicians with continuing medical education costs. This program is also available to Visiting Specialist YMA members.

CMPA Program

To reimburse eligible physicians for their CMPA dues. This program is available to resident non-members and locum physicians.

General Practitioner Oncology Training Support Program

To provide financial assistance to family physicians who reside and practice in the Yukon and who complete the General Practitioner Oncology (BPO) training program offered by the British Columbia Cancer Agency (BCCA).

Locum Support Program

The fund provides for the reimbursement of usual and reasonable expenses incurred in the provision of locum services in the Yukon.

Parental Program

To provide partial income replacement for a physician parent who wants to take a temporary leave from Yukon practice for the birth/adoption of a child.

New Graduates of CCFP Program

to provide financial assistance with the repayment of medical student loans that have been incurred by recent graduates with a Certificate of the College of Family Physicians of Canada

New Graduates of RCPSC Program

to provide financial assistance with the repayment of post-graduate student loans that have been incurred by recent Certificants of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

Office Renovation Program

To assist resident family physicians with office renovations required to accommodate a newly-recruited physician.

Office Startup Program

To assist newly-recruited family physicians with setting up an office.

Preceptor Program

To encourage Yukon physicians to become preceptors for visiting medical residents.

Physician Relocation Program

To assist recruited physicians with their relocation costs.

Recruitment Program

To promote the recruitment of new physicians to Yukon, by providing financial incentives.

Retention Program

To promote the retention of practicing physicians in Yukon, by providing financial incentives.

UpToDate Fund

To subsidize an annual YMA group subscription to the UpToDate medical resource.

**** Annual General Meeting and CME Update**

The Annual General Meeting of the YMA is held the first Friday of November each year. The following Saturday and Sunday is the annual YMA CME Update. The CME Update runs a full-day Saturday and half-day Sunday and is generally accredited by the College of Family Physicians of Canada for 9 Main-Pro credits.

Additional Member Benefits**Physician and Family Support Program**

YMA Membership FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

I am practicing part-time (three days a week), do I have to pay the "full" fee?

The Yukon Medical Association does not offer a part-time membership so yes you would have to pay for a Full Membership.

I will be practicing in your territory for a short period of time (doing locums), what is my membership fee?

We do not offer a locum category of membership fee. However for each month you bill insured medical services in the Yukon you are eligible for full reimbursement of your CMPA. Please contact the association for details.

Who is eligible for the 'non-resident' category of membership?

A non-resident membership is for any physician who practices in a jurisdiction other than the Yukon, whose primary residence is outside the Yukon and is not a Visiting Specialist to the Yukon. The fee is 5% of the Full Membership and allows the member access to the YMA private listserv.

I will be on maternity leave for part of the year, am I entitled to a reduced fee?

No, however you may apply to the YMA-administered Parental Fund which provides partial income replacement for a physician parent who wants to take a temporary leave from Yukon practice following the birth/adoption of a child. Please contact the association for details.

I am temporarily out of practice due to illness, am I entitled to a reduced fee?

Depending on the anticipated length of medical leave you may qualify to apply for membership under a Special Consideration category. Each case is adjudicated on an individual basis.

I have student membership with your Association but will be starting a residency program in June. Do I have to pay an additional fee at that time?

The YMA does not charge a YMA fee for medical students or residents to join the association; however the YMA is a conjoint division with the CMA. That means that you must be a member of the CMA to join the YMA.

I have relocated from another province and my divisional and CMA fees are paid to the end of the year, do I have to pay additional fees to your province?

No, if you have paid your Full CMA fees already in the year that you join the YMA we do not collect them again.

If I leave the province during the year, am I entitled to a partial refund of membership dues?

No, we do not provide partial refunds of membership fees.

Do I receive a membership card every year?

No, the YMA does not provide membership cards.
